**Encountering Christ Our  
Hope**

Pope Francis gives us a clear vision for the Jubilee Year of Hope (December 24, 2024-January 6, 2026): "For everyone ,

may the Jubilee be a moment of gratitude, personal encounter with the Lord Jesus, the 'door' of our salvation, whom the Church is charged to proclaim always, everywhere and to all as 'our hope.'"

**The Renewal of Our Minds and Hearts in Christ** (cont. from previous bulletin) May this Year of Hope be a time for our parishes to recommit to ongoing and life-long catechesis and formation so that we are "always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you." (1 Pt 3:15) This encounter with Christ through catechesis and ongoing formation is essential for the New Evangelization to take root. "The New Evangelization in which the whole continent is engaged means that faith cannot be taken for granted but must be explicitly proposed in all its breadth and richness. This is the principal objective of catechesis, which, by its very nature, is an essential aspect of the New Evangelization. 'Catechesis is a process of formation in faith, hope and charity; it shapes the mind and touches the heart, leading the person to embrace Christ fully and completely. It introduces the believer more fully into the experience of the Christian life, which involves the liturgical celebration of the mystery of the Redemption and the Christian service of other.' **Intentional discipleship** is the decision to "drop one's nets": to make a conscious commitment to follow Jesus in the midst of his Church as an obedient disciple and to reorder one's life accordingly. It is the single most important decision a person can possibly make (which is why Jesus calls us to count the cost).

It can be as dramatic as St. Paul blinded on the road to Damascus or as invisible as a quiet resolve. It can be done by an atheist like Edith Stein declaring, "This is the truth!" after encountering Christ through Teresa of Avila or by a lifelong Catholic returning to his roots like Ignatius of Loyola. But however we arrive at it, that resolve to follow Jesus consciously and intentionally with our whole heart, soul, mind, and strength is what the entirety of the Christian call to discipleship is all about. Once made, that choice will henceforth be the controlling factor that will drive and coordinate everything—absolutely everything—in the life of the disciple of Jesus Christ. When we make this choice, as Paul says, "We destroy arguments and every pretension raising itself against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive in obedience to Christ" (2 Cor 10:5). Here begins the new life.
