Praying To The Holy Spirit – The Church’s public prayers (Mass, sacraments, and Divine Office) begin and end with, “In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.” Reflecting on the words of the liturgy, quietly and prayerfully, is a good way to appreciate the presence of the Holy Spirit in the Christian life.

Praying to the Holy Spirit before making significant decisions and remembering His presence in troubled times enable us to see the bigger picture, one centered on the love of God and one another, as directed toward our eternal salvation.

A Final Word - As children, we learned the significance of the Holy Spirit as a guide and comforter in troubles times. As adults, we realize that the Holy Spirit is central to God’s action of creating and sustaining the universe, revealing God’s will in the Old and New Testaments, in Jesus’ and the Church’s life in keeping her free from error, in the sacraments, and in the prayers of the Church and of individual Christians,

To accomplish God’s mission of salvation, we need the Holy Spirit and the Holy Spirit needs us to continue His work on earth. We are the hands and voices of the Father when we reflect the way of life that Jesus taught us and carry out the directives of the Holy Spirit. These help us fulfil our mission on earth and prepare us for eternity.

Easy fundraising for the Church - Both King Soopers and Safeway participate in a shoppers’ reward program which donates a percentage of the money spent at their store to St. Mary of the Rockies. **Our parish receives approximately \$700 annually from the rewards programs.**
